MINUTES, MEETING OF 06/25/2018

1. Call to Order 6:07 p.m.
2. Approval of Minutes from 05/02/2018 with attendance listing correction. Motion by Justin Doughty, Geoff Summa, 2nd. Unanimous
3. Harbormaster Report: Requests made of the HM to ensure that tie-up times are properly funded for all boats using the public float.
4. Old Business:
 - Status of the LPA's: Nothing significant to report at this time.
5. New Business:
 1. Suggestions for Cousins Island Float rules. Currently, the Coastal Waters Ordinance does not make any specific rules regarding tie-ups. Numerous complaints have been presented regarding contractor and non-island vessels essentially using the float as a private marina. This has been not only for the number, but also size of vessels. Per the Interlocal Agreement with the town of Yarmouth, Section 3(e), "the Town of Chebeague Island shall manage and control the use of ramp and float on the northerly side of Cousins Island dock consistent with the limitations and terms of this agreement." With this in mind, a motion was made by Justin Doughty, seconded by Geoff Summa and approved by all to recommend to the ToCI BoS that Section 8 "Cousins Island Float System" **Length Restriction** be amended to be changed from "per interlocal agreement" to "up to 17'" and **Time Restriction** amended from "per interlocal agreement" to "the discretion of the Chebeague Island Harbor Master. The float is not intended to serve as a primary berth for any vessel."
 2. The use of a mooring to moor a derelict vessel will be solved by the owner placing the normally moored working float back on the mooring.
 3. Yarmouth finger floats were not worth bidding on.
